



## Level System

### Level 1

- To prepare officials to begin officiating Minor Hockey

### Level 2

- To further develop an official's skills and abilities.
- Have to be 16
- Pass the annual exam with a minimum of 70%

### Level 3

- To prepare officials to start working higher levels of hockey
- Capable of working Minor Hockey Regional Playoffs and Female National Championships
- Have to be 16
- Have been a Level II for a year
- Pass the annual exam with a minimum of 80%
- Pass an on-ice game situation supervision

### Level 4

- To prepare officials to work National and International Tournaments
- Have to be certified as a Level III for a year
- Be invited to a special Level 4/5 Seminar
- Pass the SRD Exam with a minimum of 80%
- Pass the dry land and on-ice fitness tests
- Pass two on-ice game situation supervisions
- Complete the post Seminar Assignment

### Level 5

- To prepare officials to work Regional Championships as a referee
- Have to be certified as a Level IV for a year
- Be invited to a special Level 4/5 Seminar
- Pass the SRD Exam with a minimum of 90%
- Pass the dry land and on-ice fitness tests
- Pass one on-ice game situation supervision
- Complete the post Seminar Assignment

### Level 6

- To prepare officials to work National and International Tournaments as a referee
- Have to be certified as a Level VI for a year
- SHA submits your name to Hockey Canada who then makes selection from across the country
- Attend a Hockey Canada Level VI Seminar
- Pass the SRD exam with a minimum of 90%
- Pass the dry land and on-ice fitness tests
- Pass one on-ice game situation supervision
